Outside lights were set-up on the perimeter of the sanctuary by Fred Mossman, Pastor Jim, and Bobby Carter, in order to light up the stained- glass windows on Christmas Eve. It made for a nice ambiance during the candle lighting. The locks on the outside trash receptacles have been removed at a savings of \$47 per month.

The leak in the roof of the sanctuary has been repaired.

Trustees Bert Roper and Vivian Chicconi coordinated a signage project for the church campus, the first phase of which has been completed on the front glass doors. The second phase will be identification of the interior doors.

Trustee Fred Mossman, along with his wife, Martha, replaced the fluorescent lights on the East side of the sanctuary with LED tubes, and we are in the process of replacing the lights on the West side of the sanctuary as well.

Vice-chair, Bert Roper, received bids and is coordinating the cleaning of all of the carpeted areas of the church, as well as both sides of the pew pads in the sanctuary. This will be accomplished the first few days in January. We would like to thank in advance the volunteers that have been recruited to assist with moving of furniture and large items as needed.

Finance chair, Nancy Simpson, and Trustees Vice-Chair, Bert Roper, will be heading up a capital funds campaign to raise money for the landscape project.

All of the long-term facility use agreements are being updated for 2025. We would like to remind everyone that any room usage needs to be requested in writing to the office, so that

the pastor and the trustees chair are able to approve and schedule events. This will ensure that the rooms are properly reserved and prepared.

As a reminder, all church members are welcomed and encouraged to attend any Trustees meeting. The next regular meeting is scheduled for January 7, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. in the Conference Room. Elections will be held for the Trustee positions of Secretary, Vice-Chair and Chair for 2025 year at that time.

Estate Planning and RMDs

Remembering your church in your estate

This is a brand-new year, and it is a good time to think about estate planning. We all have something to pass on to others when we leave this world, and whether you are a young person or an older adult, you need to think about how you want to distribute what you have so that others can benefit. We don't know when our final moment will come, so it is never too soon to make those plans.

Your church can be a beneficiary of your estate or a life insurance policy. If you have not already done so, consider naming Madera United Methodist Church as a beneficiary.

Sometimes churches receive property, such as land or a building, a vehicle, or other tangible asset. This is often difficult for a church to accept. Although the donor may think it is thoughtful and generous, it sometimes causes more issues that benefits. Monetary giving is usually more beneficial for the church.

That said, our building is in constant need of attention. If you are planning to give to the church as a beneficiary, you might consider designating some of your giving to the Building Maintenance Fund.

Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and contributions to the church

If you have an individual retirement account (IRA) and you have reached the age for which you are required to distribute annually some of your account (called a Required Minimum



Distribution, or RMD), you may give some or all of this distribution to the church, with greater tax benefit than if you gave to the church from other accounts.

This is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a distribution made directly by the trustee of your individual retirement arrangement (IRA), other than an SEP or SIMPLE IRA, to certain qualified organizations. The total QCDs for the year can't be more than \$100,000.

If all the requirements are met, a QCD may be nontaxable. This means it will not be reported as income, and because it will not be in your income, it cannot be reported as a deduction on your Schedule A. However, this is a greater tax benefit than what a Schedule A deduction will give.

Some people in our church family have already taken advantage of this benefit. If you would like to hear more about it, contact the administrator of your IRA.

Get to know your church family

How well do you know the individuals in our church family? Each Sunday, we greet one another in church and gather afterwards for refreshments, but there is not enough time to learn about each other during this short visit after church.

Many of the people in our congregation are retired, and we have a variety of professions represented, including teachers, farmers, accountants, secretaries, and business

owners, to name just a few.

Often, we don't know a lot about people until after they have passed, and the obituary tells us who they were.

Beginning with the next Grapevine, we will profile people in our church family, either as individuals or as a couple. We will honor ones who are living, and some who have passed.

So, stay tuned and read your Grapevine. The next person profiled could be you.
