April 2025 From the Pastor

We admire people who have lots of resilience and determination. We call people "heroic" when they press on against the odds. We call them "brave" when they refuse to give up. But is "giving up" always a bad thing? During the season of Lent many people "give up" something as a means of spiritual growth. Lent is always a good season to give up bad habits; but this meaning of "giving up" is more about stopping or abstaining from something. When we urge someone not to "give up," we usually mean, "don't surrender," or "don't stop trying." But a key aspect of being a Christian is surrender, "giving up" control of ourselves and putting God in control. Even Jesus, on the cross, "gave up" or "surrendered" his spirit – letting go of his physical life to save us from spiritual death. Accepting Christ as our Lord means "giving up" the driver's seat to Jesus and letting him guide us.

Another sense of "giving up" is to quit trying. We value effort and persistence. But is there also a time to quit trying? God asks us to always give our best effort to follow Christ, but sometimes our biggest spiritual breakthroughs come when we give up. We need to give up trying to earn God's love and approval. We need to give up trying to earn our salvation. We need to give up our pride that imagines we can handle life on our own. We need to give up trying to perfect ourselves, and fix others, and make everything work out all right. Until we give up trying to do it ourselves, we aren't ready to depend on God.

So, give up trying to do it yourself and never give up trusting in God. Surrender to God, but don't surrender to temptation. Give up your bad habits but never give up on praying. Always be thankful that God has not given up on you or on me.

Committee Spotlight - UMW

Know Your Church Family



Doug Carpenter slips into a back pew in church on Sundays, but his kind heart and loving spirit is known by many within the church family.

Doug was born in Redwood City, California, and raised in Los Altos and Sunnyvale in the Bay Area. He has two sisters, both still living. Peggy lives in Sunnyvale, and Lisa lives in Los Angeles.

They were raised by parents who attended church. "I went to the Raynor Park Christian Church in Sunnyvale, where I was chairman of the property and grounds until I took this job here," he said. He remembers seeing the land cleared when the church was built. "I was the

youngest charter member of Raynor Park Christian Church," he said.

In 1994, Doug moved to Madera with his wife and eight-year-old son, Kyle. A year after, his second son, Ryan, was born.

In Sunnyvale, he had been a building inspector for 16 years. Just like his name implies, he was a carpenter. He became a foreman and then a superintendent, working his way up until he became an inspector.

"I came here (Madera) as an inspector," he said. "I worked here for four years, and I went back to the Bay Area for five years because the opportunities were good, and I knew everybody in Los Altos and Sunnyvale." After five years, he came back to the Central Valley. The City of Fresno needed inspectors. "They were having 750 inspection requests per day. Work was plentiful," he said. "Work was going nuts. Everybody was building...everywhere." So, he worked in Fresno for a couple of years, and in Salinas for seven years. "Then I got injured," he said. At that time, he retired.

When he first came to Madera, his family attended several churches. For a while, they attended Harvest Church. "It was a big, with a lot of families," he said. He liked that. "There at Harvest, they wanted the kids to go in the other room, and I wanted my boys with me because I wanted them with me every chance I could get. I had to sit in church when I was young. I had to be quiet and listen."

Later, he decided to visit other churches. "I

came to this church because my neighbors are Mary and Willie Long. I knew they would go here. I visited here, and I visited a couple of other churches. But I like this one because it kind of reminds me of the church in Sunnyvale."

Although Doug and his wife divorced, he remains connected with his sons. Kyle is in Oregon, married with one son, Remy. Doug has Remy's picture in his phone, and proudly shows the picture of his three-year-old grandson.

Ryan lives in Washington state, just north of Seattle. On April 12, Ryan and Monica will be married, and Doug will be there. He is excited for them, and looking forward to seeing both of his sons and his grandson, who he has seen only one time.

Doug loves being a part of the church family at Madera United Methodist Church. "I'm glad to be here," he said. "You guys have opened your arms, and it's just been wonderful." He wants to see our church grow, and to see more people attend church. "Not many people are going to church anymore, and it's kind of disheartening not to see young people. I love hearing children's voices when they sing. There's just nothing, nothing more pure. It just resonates. It's like those bells," he said.

The East driveway of the church was damaged by water rising to the street, thereby causing erosion. The Madera Irrigation Department (MID) closed the driveway for safety, since a sink hole is a possibility. MID is in the process of planning for the repair/replacement of the driveway.

The ceilings in the conference room and office have been painted. Cord covers were installed in the office, and finance office (covering the internet cables on the walls).

A contractor has verified that the door frames leading to the restroom in the Fireside Room can be widened to 36 inches, and Trustees is in the process of obtaining quotations for the work to be performed.

Fred Mossman replaced the two front tires on the lawnmower (tractor), tuned up the engine, and replaced the battery. David Simpson and Bobby Carter will clean it up and plan to list it for sale.

We would like to welcome Mike Chicconi to the Trustees committee. He will be replacing Vivian Chicconi who has agreed to serve on the SPRC committee. Trustees would like to thank Vivian for her service to this committee and her continued willingness to serve this church.
